- 5) Describe the sequence of events that happens once unintended behavior leads to a breakdown of community controls.
- 6) What is the real fear of graffiti? What does graffiti represent?
- 7) What are the differences an officer in a patrol car versus one walking on the street?
- 8) Describe the difference between “order-maintenance” and “law-enforcement.”
- 9) How has the shift from “order-maintenance” to “law-enforcement” changed the nature of the police and their dealing with the public?
- 10) Explain the complexities that exist with gangs-police-residents of the Robert Taylor Homes in Chicago.
- 11) What is the effect of “community watchmen”?
- 12) In what ways is a uniformed officer important (think “by stander effect”)?
- 13) What method is suggested by the article to determine how many police are needed in an area and how they are best used?
